



Pin the right sides facing each other in place. Double knot your thread and go from the back to the front. Being careful to catch both pieces of fabric, start making little back stitches at about 4 or 5 mm from the edge (0.16 or 0.20 inches).

In this sample it is only 4mm since the form is only a little less than 4 inches tall before sewing and 3 1/2 inches after it's turned inside out (before stuffing).

If you make tiny overlapping back

stitches (go down half length of the stitch and come out in front of the middle of the previous one, keeping the thread down), it will be very strong and durable. It won't have any fraying problem since the fraying edge is far enough from the stitches and once it will be inside and stuffed, there won't be anything stressing on it.



The opening I left for stuffing is a little less than one inch and it fits my index finger.

After firmly stuffing the doll, stitch it close being careful to keep the inside edges far enough from your stitches.
